

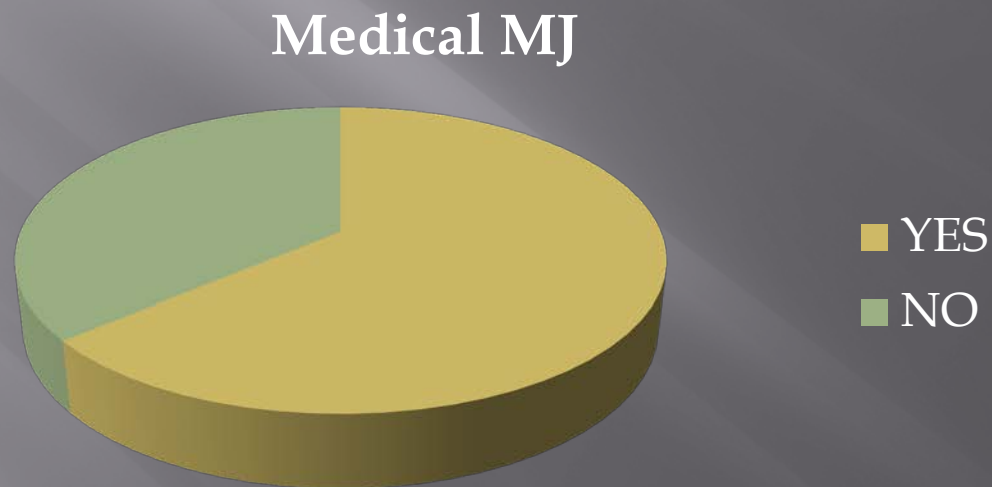

Marijuana - Large Focus

- ▣ Why? - Measure #5
- ▣ Passed 63.79% to 36.21%



- ▣ Or put another way:
- ▣ 216,042 to 122,615

Measure #5

- ▣ Became effective December 8, 2016
- ▣ 30 days after the election
 - ND Constitution Article III § 8
- ▣ However ---- SB 2154
- ▣ Suspends Medical MJ until July 31, 2017 or
 - until another version is passed
 - See SB 2344

Status of Pot?

- ▣ 7 States and DC – Recreational
- ▣ 21 States – Medical
- ▣ More have “decriminalized”

- ▣ What do the Studies show?
- ▣ Increased usage
- ▣ Lack of useful data
- ▣ No easy Impairment test like alcohol

Highlights the Importance of a DRE Program

- ▣ The Debate:
 - Is this really new or novel?
- ▣ Most case law upholds DRE methods.
- ▣ Why? Because it is simply having well trained officers making observations.
- ▣ Officers are not making medical determinations.
- ▣ Science is based on accepted principals.
