ND 200 reduced to one lane of traffic four miles west of Hurdsfield

The North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT) has reduced traffic to one lane on ND Highway 200, approximately four miles west of Hurdsfield due to flooding. Traffic is reduced to one lane and motorists must stop and take turns while traveling through the area. Traffic speeds are reduced.

The following highways are affected by flood waters, but remain open to traffic, with traffic speeds reduced:

- ND Highway 14, twelve miles north of Towner
- US Highway 83, nine miles north of Max – Temporary grade raise in place with single lanes of traffic in both directions
- ND 53, near Benedict
- ND Highway 200, four miles east of Hurdsfield - Temporary Grade raise in place with a single lane of traffic

Fluctuating water levels make it difficult to predict when and where water will go over a roadway or recede from the roadway. The NDDOT encourages motorists to check road conditions before traveling due to rapidly changing conditions.
