UPDATE: Traffic signal replacement taking place on Washington Street in Grand Forks

As part of the Washington Street rehabilitation project in Grand Forks, traffic signal replacement will take place over the next few weeks and affect some intersections along the Washington Street corridor. Motorists need to be aware of these projects so they can plan their travel time and routes accordingly.

Intersections being affected during construction are as follows:

Monday, August 11

- Washington St. & 24th Ave S. – Traffic signals are tentatively scheduled to be turned off on Monday, August 11. Motorists traveling in the eastbound and westbound lanes on 24th Ave S. will only be allowed right turn movement onto Washington Street. Stop signs will be in place only on 24th Ave S. so motorists will be required to yield to northbound and southbound Washington Street traffic. Washington Street northbound and southbound traffic will be allowed as well as right turn movements.

Wednesday, August 13

- Washington St. & 17th Ave S. – Traffic signals are tentatively scheduled to be turned off on **Wednesday, August 13**. 17th Ave S. eastbound and westbound traffic will only be allowed right turn movement onto Washington Street. Stop signs will be in place only on 17th Ave S., requiring motorists yield to northbound and southbound Washington Street traffic. Washington Street northbound and southbound traffic will be allowed as well as right turn movements.

It is expected that each intersection will be affected for approximately 3-5 days. All dates and times of the projects listed will take place weather permitting.
