NDDOT seeks comments on 2016 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) Amendment

The North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT) is seeking comments on an amendment to the 2016-2019 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) for inclusion of previously-unpublished projects in 2016.

1. Statewide pavement markings.
Total Cost: \$7 million
2. Concrete repair and an asphalt overlay on eastbound I-94 from west of Exit 248 to the Bloom Interchange.
Total Cost: \$4 million
3. Embankment and Erosion Repair on eastbound US Highway 2 west of the west junction of ND Highway 14.
Total Cost: \$500,000
4. Culvert installation or replacement on US Highway 52 about 10 miles west of the junction of ND Highway 53 near Bergen.
Total Cost: \$600,000
5. Installation of lighting on US Highway 2 at the intersection of Johnson St/29th Ave NW near Burlington.
Total Cost: \$200,000
