No Travel Advisory LIFTED; Travel Alert issued for Grand Forks & other areas of northeast North Dakota

The North Dakota Department of Transportation and the North Dakota Highway Patrol have LIFTED the **NO TRAVEL ADVISORY** for northeastern North Dakota and have issued a **Travel Alert** due to areas of icy road conditions and reduced visibility making travel challenging. Communities and areas included in the **Travel Alert** are Grand Forks, Grafton and Pembina and surrounding areas. A **Travel Alert** means conditions are such that **motorists can still travel** in these areas, but should be advised of rapidly changing conditions. Motorists are encouraged to reduce speeds and drive according to the conditions.

All travelers are encouraged to monitor road conditions as weather conditions occur and use caution while traveling. For road information, call 511 from any type of phone or go to the website: www.dot.nd.gov.

The NDDOT works hard to keep travelers informed of road conditions. However, the road conditions are not reported 24 hours a day but updated every day from 5 a.m. to 10 p.m. Central Time, including holidays. It's important to remember that the conditions may vary from what is being reported.
