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I-94 Roadwork in Bismarck-Mandan to Be Complete This Week

BISMARCK, N.D. – Roadwork that began last spring along I-94 in Bismarck-Mandan is expected to be complete this week. Crews anticipate all construction work to be done today, followed by lane striping and removal of the traffic control barriers. All lanes of traffic should be open and back to normal use by mid-week. Until roadwork is officially complete, the 12-foot width restriction remains in place, and motorists are encouraged to continue using caution, obeying all traffic controls and posted speed limits throughout the construction zone.

The NDDOT will provide another public notice once all traffic controls are removed, the 12-foot width restriction is lifted and speeds return to their normal posted limits.

This entire construction project has involved all lanes of I-94 in Bismarck-Mandan from just east of Exit 161 (Bismarck Expressway) to the west side of the Grant Marsh Bridge over the Missouri River, which is approximately 5 miles. The Interstate has remained open to east- and westbound traffic throughout the project, utilizing a combination of lane closures and head-to-head traffic, with speeds reduced to 45 mph or less throughout the corridor.
